





Upgrade guardrails / reflectors



Rumble strips





Roadway Safety Measures

Upgrade caution signs (examples)



Buffer zone for bicycle safety





Roadway Safety Measures

Paving a high-friction surface treatment (HFST)

- Helps minimize vehicles "skidding" off roadway
- Thin overlay on existing roadway
- Installed only at curves
- Does not encourage faster speeds
- Effective in all weather conditions
- Audible effects is non-existent or minimal
- Installed along Live Oak Canyon Road in 2018

Traffic Control: Keeping You & Crews Safe

Daily lane closures:

Limited to construction areas to minimize inconvenience

Brief delays in work areas, keeping you moving: Single-lane closures; two-way traffic controlled through one lane by project personnel

Lanes open outside of work hours:

Normal traffic operations outside of work hours and during weekends and holidays

Traffic Enforcement for Added Safety:

CHP coordination for traffic movement during work hours








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
